ABOUT THE COMPETITION

OVERVIEW

The MSK UAPA Moot Court Trial Competition 2026 is a unique criminal law litigation simulation designed by Jurisverse and Kraft Legal supported by M. S. Khan Associates to train law students in bail jurisprudence, constitutional liberty, national security law, and courtroom advocacy under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

Unlike traditional moot courts, this competition replicates the real courtroom progression of a UAPA bail matter - from drafting to oral advocacy to judicial reasoning analysis.

Participants will experience:

- Realistic criminal litigation workflow
- Intensive bail drafting & oral arguments
- Evidence-based advocacy
- Judicial reasoning & constitutional balancing
- Courtroom strategy under strict timelines

This competition is built to bridge the gap between law school theory and real criminal practice.

OBJECTIVES

- Develop practical criminal litigation skills
- Build expertise in bail law & UAPA jurisprudence
- Train students in time-bound drafting & advocacy
- Encourage critical thinking on liberty vs national security
- Provide real courtroom simulation experience

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

Preliminary Round:

Participants begin the competition with a written bail drafting challenge based on allegations of association with an unlawful organisation and encrypted communication groups. Teams will prepare a persuasive bail application within 24 hours, demonstrating research, clarity, structure, and understanding of the UAPA bail threshold.

Quarter-Final Round:

Qualified teams move to virtual oral rounds where sides are allocated by draw of lots and teams argue bail from one side only. The round focuses on analysing the difference between mere association and active involvement while presenting strong bail jurisprudence arguments under UAPA.

Semi-Final Round:

Top teams advance to the venue round where additional evidence such as chats, co-accused statements, and seized devices are introduced to test evidentiary analysis. Participants must present concise and strategic bail arguments while addressing conspiracy, common intention, and the *prima facie* case threshold.

Final Round:

The final round challenges the top teams to support or challenge a bail rejection order involving prolonged custody and delayed trial. Teams will present constitutional and judicial reasoning on liberty versus national security within a 30-minute advocacy round.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Eligibility:

All Law Colleges and the institutions imparting legal education (Both 5 year and 3 year LL.B. course) recognized by the Bar Council of India are eligible to participate in the competition.

Team Composition:

- Each team shall consist of a minimum of 2 members and maximum of 3 members. This team composition cannot be altered under any circumstances.
- Every team shall consist of two speakers. Teams may have only one researcher.
- Upon completion of registration, team code will be allotted to each team. Thereafter, all correspondence shall be in reference to that team code.
- The same team code must be used by the teams during submission and oral rounds.
- Teams must NOT disclose the identity of their College/University anywhere in the Memorial. Violation of this Rule shall attract severe penalty at the sole discretion of the organisers.

Submission Format:

All drafts submitted must conform to the following general requirements:

- Drafts must be typed in MS Word with black font on A4 page size.
- The body of the drafts must be in font Times New Roman, Size 12; 1.5 line spacing.
- Each page must have a margin of at least one inch on all sides.
- There should not be any borders on the pages.
- Submission of the drafts in the deadline must be submitted before 11.59 PM and subject as - TEAM CODE | DRAFT BAIL SUBMISSION | UAPAMCC26 at **admin.jurisverse@gmail.com**

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

Dress Code:

- For Gentlemen: Western Formals (Shirt, Trousers, Coat and Tie).
- For Ladies: Western Formals or Indian Formals (Shirt, Trousers, Coat and Tie or White Kurta, Black Churidar and Coat).

Conduct:

Participants will be disqualified from the competition, if they are found misbehaving, or causing nuisance, or making abusive statements, showing disrespect towards judges, co-participants or members of the host institution. Scouting would also lead to disqualification of a team, if brought to the notice of the organizers immediately, without disturbing the round in progress.

Miscellaneous:

The organizers' decision with regard to the interpretation of rules, any matter not contemplated by the rules or any other matter related to the competition shall be final and binding. If any one of the members of a team is notified or informed of any detail or information concerning the Competition, it shall be deemed as if the said team as a whole has been duly notified or informed. All the participants shall receive detailed rules related to oral rounds and sharing of links etc. through a separate email communication. Any direction, guideline or rules which are intimated to the participants at any point during the event, shall be deemed as part of this rulebook.

All the rules are only inclusive and not exhaustive for the competition. Rules should be strictly adhered to. Any deviation from the rules shall attract disqualification or penalty as determined by the organisers.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)



Who can participate?

Students enrolled in 3-year or 5-year LL.B. programs.



How many members per team?

Minimum 2 and maximum 3 members.



Is prior moot court experience required?

No. Beginners are welcome.



Is the internet allowed in the drafting round?

Yes. The drafting round is conducted online.



Will memorials be required?

No memorials. Only drafting + oral rounds.



Will authorities be allowed during oral rounds?

Yes, participants may use bare acts and printed judgments.



Is this a national level event?

Yes, teams from across India are welcome.



What makes this moot unique?

It simulates real criminal litigation workflow rather than traditional memorial-based moots.
